



### **Nomination Guidelines for SFRR-I Trevor Slater Award Lecture 2027**

The next SFRR-International (SFRR-I) biennial meeting, organized in collaboration with and hosted by SFRR Asia, will be held in Sendai, Japan from 28-31 March 2027. We are pleased to solicit nominations for the SFRR – International Trevor Slater Award Lecture 2027.

The Trevor Slater Award is the highest award of SFRR-I and is awarded on a biennial basis to a scientist who, in the judgment of the International Scientific Committee, has made outstanding contributions to the field. It was set up in memory of Trevor Slater, a founder and first President of the Society. The award consists of a medal and certificate. The recipient must present a lecture at the Biennial meeting where the award is made and is required to contribute an invited review article to Free Radical Biology & Medicine, which will be available as an open source publication, at no charge to the author.

Once the nominations have been received, the SFRR – International Executive Committee and members of an International Scientific Committee will evaluate these nominations and select the Trevor Slater Award Lecturer for 2027. The selection criteria include: outstanding lifetime contributions to the field of redox biology, free radicals and antioxidants. Additionally, the nominee has provided service to the redox biology community, and leadership in one or more of the “Free Radical Societies”. Letters of nomination may include one or more nominators, but nominators are limited to one nominee. Nomination(s) together with the nominee’s abbreviated CV and list of up to 10 peer-reviewed publications with citations, nominee’s Scopus *h*-index and the URL for the nominee’s research website should be uploaded as a **single PDF file** to the submission system.

**Deadline for receipt of nominations by submission system is 19 June 2026.**
